WHAT IS MAVERICK SOUNDS

Maverick Sounds is an organisation that works in prisons and in the community with young people and adults. The aim is to positively engage those who participate with our company through music. We do this by providing a safe space for the participants to grow in skills such as lyric writing, beat producing, recording, mixing and mastering songs as well as empowering them to make positive choices in their lives. Learners get the creative space and relevant stimuli that is needed to grow, both in confidence and ability.

The program gives learners ownership over their own education and the opportunity to participate in the process. In the case of Maverick Sounds, learners bring their own creative gifts and urban preference to the course: they also voice the issues and pressures that are relevant to them in their current environment.

Rather than sitting passively in a classroom, participants undertake highly practical activities interspersed with games and discussions, helping them to reflect creatively on their own strengths, weaknesses and preconceptions. The desired outcome is for participants to gain the knowledge, maturity and skills necessary to impact the culture of prison in a positive way by leading by example. Upon completion of the music programme each participant will have the opportunity to keep a copy of the songs they have created on a CD or perform the songs in front of staff and peers under prison permission.

Learners will also gain the ability to learn a skill that is a flexible and easy way of earning money in the community. Sign posting support is offered to offenders approaching release and links are made in the community if appropriate.



MAVERICK SOUNDS IMPACT

Maverick Sounds has been working In prisons as a company for 2 years. Prior to that Samuel McPherson the director worked with a number of organisations to provide music in Prisons and in the community.

The statistics given have informed the work and belief that what Maverick Sounds provides as a company will have a lasting impact on those that find themselves in trouble with the law.

Maverick Sounds has had a huge impact on the BME population in the establishments they have worked in. Often the men and young people have felt misunderstood and under represented in the justice system.

As we can see from the statistics there is an over representation in the prisons and the re-offending rate is higher for those from a BME background. Music has a way of engaging and supporting both the confidence, belief and mental health of those in the justice system and those at risk of going in. It is not about creating the next music star but about giving skills and techniques to manage themselves.

Maverick sounds seeks to use music to enable people from all walks of life to help reflect, observe and discuss their life stories and plans to move forward. We have supported participants once released from prison to use music as a way to use their time in a meaningful way, help other people and continue their journey of reflection on they're lives.


